editors' note

BE PREPARED

Notwithstanding our wish that June would not come "too soon". June 1 is just days away.

We should not bury our heads in the sand and pretend that June is going to slip by. Instead we must check our homes and our insurance coverage and begin preparing for the 2019 hurricane season.

Assess your home's readiness. If post Maria repairs are not yet complete, ensure that the key components of the structure are strengthened including the roof. foundation, windows and doors. Trim tree branches and check around for loose items which can become missiles. Identify and improve areas that are prone to flooding.

Check your insurance coverage to ensure you are not only covered but also adequately covered. Come in to a NCCU branch, or visit your insurance company for details and advice.

Approach your insurance provider about insuring the contents of your home. Try negotiating a reduced rate to assist with this. If you can't insure all contents, consider insuring your more valuable items.

- · your motor vehicle insurance policy covers "Acts of God" perils
- the contents of your house are insured

PERSONAL PREP

- Ensure your passports are valid beyond November 30, 2019
- · Obtain certified copies of Birth and Marriage Certificates from the Registry.

KEEP YOUR CERTIFCATE OF TITLE AT NCCU

It is important that you keep your Certificate of Title (COT) with NCCU as you will need to borrow again and again for domestic, personal, education and other purposes after taking a mortgage. Your COT will be needed to secure these loans

It may be difficult to get small loans from the financial institution that is trying to persuade you to bring your mortgage to them. Their policies may impose a wait period, or other restrictions, on the granting of small loans to a new mortgage borrower. Also, some institutions are mortgage lenders only and do not offer personal and consumer loans to customers.

Bear in mind that it is not always about the loan interest rate. Access to credit when you need it is important as well. And NCCU, and credit unions in general, have a track record of funding small loans for members when a need arises for additional credit, or in the event of an emergency.

Think ahead. Keep your COT at NCCU so you won't have to scramble to find a co-maker. guarantor or fall victim to a quick money fix when you need a small loan, or run the risk of misplacing this important document.

Safe-keeping fees are applicable.

INVEST IN MORE MEMBER SHARES

Permanent Shares are members' long term investment in NCCU and help to strengthen the Society and build its capital. Shares cost only \$50 each and can be purchased vear round.

Members earn annual dividends on Shares, once the credit union makes a surplus. A 10% dividend was paid in 2017. Dividends are posted to your savings or deposit accountMembers earn annual dividends on Shares, once the credit union makes a surplus. Dividends are posted to a deposit/ saving account. NCCU paid a 10% dividend on Shares in 2018.


